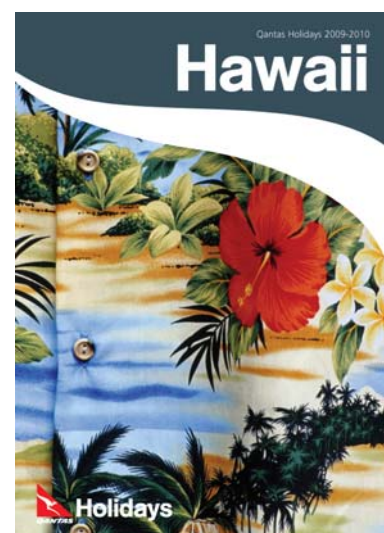

Honolulu's large harbour still bears the scars from the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbour in 1941. Visitors can tour the site including the haunting Arizona Memorial. Maui is consistently voted one of the best island destinations in the world. Dominated by the extinct Haleakala Crater, Maui offers visitors as much adventure or relaxation as they desire. If you love beautiful beaches and spectacular scenery, this island has your name on it. With over 15 golf courses it's also a golfer's mecca. The oldest of the Hawaiian Islands, Kauai is also known as the 'Garden Island' – a tropical paradise of unspoiled beauty, covered by dense rainforest. The coastline offers some excellent beaches that are great for swimming, and the snorkelling at Lydgate is sensational. The biggest island, Hawaii, is a land of contrasts - dense rainforest one minute, vast rock-hard lava fields the next, and then black, white or green sand beaches. Mt Kilauea, one of the five volcanoes that form the island, is one of the world's most active. The 'Big Island' contains stunning resorts and golf courses, which are features amongst eerie lunar-like landscapes formed by lava flows. A visit to Volcanoes National Park is a must.
